Dear Mr. Hannah:

I have read the article in <u>Ramparts</u>, and I have heard your answer on the television news broadcasts and read those of Professor Fishel in Time.

Your comment that Ramparts has no right to make a whipping boy of Michigan State University seems to me to be quite beside the point, and unresponsive to the several issues raised by the authors of the article.

Many Americans are just now beginning to learn of the sordid background of the American involvement in Vietnam. Others of us have known a good deal of it for several years. Research for my doctoral dissertation helped to enlighten me. When the full story is known to the public at large, there will be plenty of blame to go around. Michigan State will not be the sole "whipping boy." Indeed, there is no need for any whipping boys, but much need for some honest soul searching that may help to restore America's self respect and self-confidence.

You and other responsible officials at Michigan State could help by facing squarely the part you have played instead of being petulant, evasive, and indulging in McCarthyist tactics such as those of Professor Fishel in his comments on the authors of the article.

One does not expiate dishonor by indulging in further dishonorable tactics.
