### 1. Situation

### 2. Operations

### a) Personnel

 Paul Shields, police advisor, arrived in Saigon to begin a two year tour, bringing the staff total up to eight.

2) Mr. Johnson Munroe, Chief Police Advisor, USOM/ Phnom Penh, Cambodia, visited MSUG on August 29, 1959.

### b) Training

 Riot shotgun and revolver training was given to the members of the VBI Command School class on August 6, 7,
13, 20 and 27. This consisted of lectures and range shooting.

2) Firearms instructors from the Saigon Municipal Police continued to received advance training two days per week in the use and care of the revolver.

3) The MSUG staff continued to lecture two days per week at the VBI Command School.

4) Distribution of the Police Training Manual was completed. In addition to the Police and Security Services, 1500 copies were given to the Civil Guard who in turn have distributed the book to regional and provincial commands and all Civil Guard training schools.

## c) <u>Security Services</u>

VBI (Surete)

1. Work on the National Identity Card Program was heavily curtailed during the month of August because of the National Assembly election. The work teams completed their program in Long An Province and returned to Saigon. The number of identity cards taken for the month of August was not available as of this date.

2) Lieut. Cam of the Identification Bureau reported the following data on fingerprint cards received, classified and filed:

### Municipal Police

1) Twelve mobile radio units have been installed in as many new Saigon Municipal Police jeeps. This installation was completed just prior to the National Assembly election

and was of considerable value to the police on election day.

2) Because of the unusually heavy preoccupation with election assignments, it was not possible for the MSUG to work with the Saigon Municipal Police during the month of August beyond holding several conferences and discussions relative to police activities during the pre-election period.

d) <u>Communications</u>

1) Four members of the Saigon Municipal Police Department have received practical training in installation and maintenance of the radio equipment installed in the jeeps mentioned above.

2) The teletype equipment between Saigon and Hue has not become operative due to the inability of the technician to complete the installation. This technician was sent to Saigon by the equipment supplier. A MSUG technician will go to Hue early in September to complete the work unless the equipment supplier sends a capable technician to Saigon.

3) The communications program for the Police and Security Services of Vietnam is being re-evaluated in keeping with a change in procurement policy suggested by USOM. It is anticipated that this revision will continue into the month of September.

4) Much time has been spent during the month of August in an effort to secure a satisfactory teacher for basic radio training course to be given in Saigon. The

instructor is currently in the process of being cleared by GVN and it is anticipated that he will begin teaching in September.

e) Participant Training

1) A 20 hour schedule of pre-departure orientation lectures to be delivered by MSUG staff was prepared. Lectures began on August 10 and will continue through September 18.

2) Twelve participants just returned from the US have been interviewed and arrangements have been made for succeeding visits with members of this group.

f) <u>Commodities</u>

1) Commodities as listed on the attached Annex II were received during the month of August and turned over to the Saigon Municipal Police

Mr. Sloane, Municipal Section

During the month the Municipal Police increased their activity as the Assembly Elections drew near. This activity in the form of increased street patrols, inspection of vehicular traffic and a close check of pedestrians, especially at night, has been noted and more than doubled since the explosion of plastic bombs at various printing establishments throughout the city on the night of 13 August.

The Saigon Municipal Police have been assigned the responsibility of protecting American personnel and guarding the American homes within the city. They are doing everything within their power to prevent any incident occurring to American personnel and dependents. This assignment includes not only the guarding of the several MAAG, USOM and other US governmental agency buildings, but also the homes of US personnel.

Twenty mobile radio units have been installed in twenty new Saigon Municipal Police jeeps. This installation of radio equipment just before the Assembly elections has aided the police tremendously in greater maneuverability and closer contact with headquarters.

The Municipal Police advisor assisted in riot shotgun training of VBI Command School on August 6; lectured to class on August 7; and gave range revolver training to entire class on August 13, 20 and 27.

Discussed police problems of Vietnam on several occasions with a number of returned police participants.

#### GENERAL

Distribution of the Police Training Manual has been completed. In addition to the Police and Security Services, 1500 copies were given to the Civil Guard, who in turn sent copies to Regional and Provincial Commands and to all Civil Guard training schools throughout Vietnam.

#### TRAINING

A group of top firearms instructors from the Saigon Municipal Police continue to receive advanced training two days each week in the use and care of the 38 Smith & Wesson revolver.

Conversion of English soundtracks to Vietnamese language ofpolice training films continues.

Members of the police staff continue to lecture two days per week at the second VBI Command School in Saigon, which began on July 6. This school consists of 60 district chiefs of the Surete Services who are from all parts of Vietnam.

Numerous conferences were held during the month with Vietnamese officials dealing with police training.

Monthly Report for August - Communications Section

Activities in the communications field have progressed slowly due to the forthcoming elections. The installation of the mobile and portable equipment for the Saigon Police has been completed. Four men from this service have had some practical training in installation and maintenance as a result of this program.

The teletype equipment in Hue has not become operative as was originally planned due to incompetence on the part of the technician provided by the equipment supplier. Plans are tentatively made for the MSU technician to travel to Hue early next month to complete the work.

A change in procurement policy has necessitated the re-evaluation of the communications program and the rewriting of the specifications for a large portion of the equipment which has been let out to bid. This re-evaluation and specification revision is expected to continue into next month.

The long delayed basic radio training course for some twenty local technicians appears to be about to begin. The repeated postponements and delays have been due to the lack of suitable teachers. A man with the necessary background and training has been located and will commence his work as soon as the necessary clearances have been given by the Vietnamese government. Every indication has been given that this will occur next month.

Monthly Report for August - Participants

1. Prepared a twenty-hour schedule for the orientation of forty police participants. The lectures, delivered by four members of the Police Division staff, began August 10 and will be completed September 18. The orientation is for the purpose of acquainting the future participants with the objectives, philosophy and substantive techniques of law enforcement in the United States.

2. Prepared the comprehensive outlines for six hours of orientation lectures to be delivered during September.

3. Attended and participated in numerous conferences relative to PIO/P amendments and other matters pertinent to the participant program, with Mr. Waltman.

4. Accompanied Mr. Waltman in the group interview of 12 returned participants. Visited with individual participants during a two week period.
