



Anthony Harrigan

This newest book on the Viet Nam war provides a concise yet revealing insight into this crucial struggle. Harrigan, a well known military writer and foreign correspondent, points out the peculiar characteristics of this guerrilla war, describes the terrain, and analyzes the war's progress. He then presents an accurate portrayal of both the Viet Cong and the much maligned Arvin soldier; evaluates new weapons and techniques being introduced by the American forces and details the operations of the South Vietnamese "Junk Navy" and its American Navy advisors in their fight for control of Vietnamese rivers and coastal waters.

In a series of vignettes, Harrigan then discusses the problems of village defense, strategic hamlets; countering the Viet Cong with their own terror tactics; how the Viet Cong were able to penetrate and inflict heavy damage on important U.S. bases. Harrigan evaluates the effect American air power is having on the VC, including the use of the B-52 heavy bombers. He maintains that the American fighting men in South Viet Nam have quickly and effectively adapted themselves to the terrain and consequently have refuted the supposition that U.S. troops would "get bogged down in Asian jungles."

Anthony Harrigan, presently Associate Editor and military writer for the Charleston News & Courier, is a member of the Strategy Staff of the American Security Council and has recently joined **PANTHER PUBLICATION'S** Board of Advisors. His articles have appeared in the Marine Corps Gazette, Australian Army Journal, Commando, Armor, Ordnance, Military Review, Canadian Military Journal, Royal United Service Institute Journal, Revue Militaire Generale and others.

This full-scale study of both the South and the invading North provides essential background for an understanding of the conflict. Drawing on ten years of firsthand observation of this battlefield, Dr. Fall, the author of STREET WITHOUT JOY shows how the "First Indochina War," culminating in the French defeat at Dien Bien Phu, opened the way to the division between North and South. He examines the tactics of the Communist guerrillas invading the South, using their pre-1954 experience in coercing and convincing the peasantry to become their passive accomplices. And he

explores the South Vietnamese response, relying on conventional, less mobile strategy, long hamstrung by a rigid government that did not command the loyalty of its people. The new rulers will have to move guickly to overcome the chaos and to unify the country against a North whose tentacles now reach down into the rice-rich tip of South Viet Nam.
