FRANCE IS FIRST IMPORTER FROM AND EXPORTER TO VIET NAM

SAIGON, March 19 -- The Customs House has recently released statistics about the foreign trade of Viet Nam in 1957. Here are the figures compared with that of 1955 and 1956.

As shown by the above table, Viet Nam exports in 1957 increased by 76% and imports 32%, compared with the year 1956.

The trade balance remained unfavourable but some improvement was recorded as compared with the preceding years in 1955 the exports were 26% of the imports; in 1956, 20% and in 1957, 27%.

Imported products were the same fabrics, pharmaceutical products and gasoline. But the quantity of engines and equipment materials imported in 1957 is far larger than imported in 1955 and 1956.

Rubber again ranked first among exported products. But a boom was registered on the 1957 cereal exportation, which is forecast to get more importance in the forthcoming years on account of the government sponsored land development program.

France took the lead in both import and export transactions with Viet Nam. She supplied pharmaceutical products, beverages, rubber items, paper, books, thread, fabrics, metal products, electric machines, cars. She purchased raw rubber and farm products.

Next came the USA which supplied Viet Nam with milk, wheat flour, tobacco, pharmaceutical products, fabrics, cars and purchased its rubber.

Japan came third, after the USA, but she imported very few Vietnamese products. She sold building materials, paper, sewing thread, machines.

Cambodia exported to Viet Nam: livestock, vegetables, oil seeds and timber. She imported from Viet Nam: beverages, metal products, wool products, earthen ware.

French Western Africa and Algeria were among main purchase of being up to 173 million and 104 million piaster worth of cereal respectively
