DATE AND PLACE

The Regional Seminar on Social Research and Problems of Rural Life in South East Asia, sponsored by UNESCO, F.A.O. and The Asia Foundation, will take place in Saigon, Vietnam, from the 18th to the 26th of March 1960, at the Diên-Hồng Conference Hall.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The Seminar on Social Research and Problems of Rural Life in South East Asia is organized by the Vietnam National Commission for UNESCO and the University of Saigon under the sponsorship of UNESCO, F.A.O. and The Asia Foundation.

The Seminar will be concerned with the social problems of rural life in relation to economic development and the raising of living standards. It will be of a technical and specialist character and will deal with the problem of rural life from the standpoint of social research and training in the use of the methods and approaches of the social sciences.

The Seminar will bring together specialists concerned with the social aspects of economic development programmes in rural areas of South East Asia. It will bring together specialists from the region defined as Burma, Cambodia, Hongkong, Indonesia, Laos, Malaya, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam. A number of experts from other regions of the world and specialists from the United Nations and its specialized Agencies will also participate.

FOREIGN EXCHANGE

The Delegates may bring into Viet-Nam any amount of foreign exchange in the form of cash, bank drafts, travelers cheques, etc... Vietnamese currency notes in excess of VN \$ 400 may not be imported.

On leaving Viet-Nam, the Delegates may take out with them any amount of foreign exchange provided that such amount does not exceed the amount brought by them into Viet-Nam. The Delegates will be required to declare on arrival, as well as on departure the amount of foreign exchange in their possession.

The exchange rate is the free market rate of the day in Saigon.
