I assume you have approved Kimball since we sent his form a long time ago and since Art and Larry Baril seem to think there is no problem. Both Dagen and Kimball should begin briefing about the first of April, although various clearances may delay this somewhat.

We have talked to Johnson of Grand Rapids and he appears ready to go also so we may have a total of four new police people for you within the next few months. In addition, Art has sent out a bunch of letters and is following up on the leads your team put together for him. I hope things continue at this pace.
