In accordance with our telephone conversation of today's date I am attaching hereto:

  - Copy of a contract between Western Electronics Corporation, Mr. A. Y. Cottrell "owner" and Westrex for Cottrell's installation trip.
  - Copy of a letter from Mr. A. Y. Cottrell to us dated August 2nd.

Copy of a letter from Mr. A. Y. Cottrell to Mr. Rundlett dated July 29th.

X. Saigon's cablegram of August 9th.

From the Central Purchasing Authority's letter of July 18th, you will note that Mr. Rundlett was authorized to discuss and approve specifications of the equipment and that we were also informed by the same letter that he might be in a position to assist us in engaging a qualified installation technician.

On the basis of the above letter and with full and prior knowledge of Mr. Rundlett we signed the contract with the installation technician selected and approved by the latter and we have allowed Mr. Rundlett to order additional Motorola items which he considered necessary and which did not appear in the original list of items forming part of the contract with the Central Purchasing Authority. We understand that these items are necessary spare parts and do not run into very much more money.

Telephone Chelsea 3-2300 They will be gathered together with some additional tools recommended first by Mr. Cottrell and authorized by Mr. Rundlett. The tools are part of item 2 of the contract. These additional items were not quoted originally but Mr. Rundlett assured the writer personally he would see that the Central Purchasing Authority paid our Mr. Buck (in Saigon) or us directly for these additional items. Our reading of the Central Purchasing Authority's letter of July 18th would permit the additional items to be added.

As we informed you by telephone, Saigon's cablegram requested cancellation of requirement for installation engineer was transmitted from there on the 9th. Our office is closed on Saturdays so we received it this morning, Monday, August 12th.

In view of Saigon's request for prompt action in expediting as indicated in their July 18th letter, we wasted no time and agreed to Mr. Rundlett's selection of the technician and we signed a contract with him for the installation in Saigon. This morning on receipt of the cancellation cable we tried to contact Mr. Cottrell in Lenoir, North Carolina, but he had left already. We contacted him today in Chicago after you had spoken to him but he refused to withdraw from the contract at this late date, stating that he had spend considerable time, effort and money in order to prepare rapidly for the trip; he had also contracted the services of a man to supervise his own organization in North Carolina in his absence. He also informed me that Mr. Rundlett stated he expected to arrive in Saigon one week before he did and that Rundlett was confident he could get the Central Purchasing Authority to withdraw the cancellation of installation.

Westrex Corporation is in no respect at fault in this matter. We proceeded promptly because of the urgency of this project. Mr. Rundlett was kept informed at all times of every step of the entire transaction. We believe that we have the right to expect that your organization see that Westrex is held harmless in this matter. As you know, we offered to cancel if Mr. Cottrell would agree to said cancellation. Unfortunately, he would not.

INSTALLATION SUPERVISION CONTRACT SAIGON POLICE - SAIGON, VIET-NAM

Westrex agrees to pay the Western Electronics Corporation of Lenoir, North Carolina a fee of \$65 per day for the services of time spent after arrival in Saigon in installing the equipment indicated below, plus ten days of travel time. The ten days of travel time are estimated to be more than sufficient for the trip from U.S.A. from Saigon. Living expenses, meals, lodging and personal are to be paid by the Installation Supervisor and are not chargeable to the account of Westrex. Westrex Corporation will provide first-class round trip air fare or ticket between New York and Saigon.

Payment under this contract will be made upon the Installation Supervisor's return with submission of invoices duly approved by Mr. Peter Buck in Saigon. Passports, visas, all insurances, innoculation and any other official documents for this trip shall be secured and paid for by the Installation Supervisor.

This contract is for the duration of this single installation estimated to be approximately four  $(l_i)$  weeks, plus ten days travel time.

The Installation Supervisor shall be ready to leave for Saigon on or about August 15, 1957. Departure date will depend on arrival of the equipment in Saigon. Westrex shall endeavor to give as much advance notice as possible, but Installation Supervisor shall be ready to leave on next flight, where booking is possible, after notified to depart by Westrex.

The Installation Supervisor shall be responsible to, and act only under the instructions of Westrex Manager, Mr. Peter Buck, and shall conduct himself in such a manner so as not to bring discredit or adverse criticism upon himself or Westrex by any Viet-Namese government or civil personnel. Any breach of this paragraph shall be cause for immediate cancellation of the contract and reimbursement to Westrex of any and all monies paid to or for the Installation Supervisor.

The equipment covered in this contract shall be installed in a neat professional manner in accordance with Westrex and Motorola standards of good workmanship. Inspection and approval of the installation, mechnical, electrical and operational will be made by Mr. Peter Buck, Westrex Manager of our Singapore branch.

The Material to be installed and operating not latter than September 15, 1957 is as follows:

- 4 Motorola I53GAB-1 Base Station equipments, handsets type microphone with hang up box, ground plane antenna, 150 feet RGSU coaxial cable and fittings
- 40 Motorola T43GGV-5 Dash Mount Mobile sets and roof top antennas (6 velt operation)

The following test equipment is being shipped with the equipment:

- 2 P8501B Test Sets (Motorola)
- 1 FLMU-2LB(A)1G Motorola Frequency and Modulation Meter
- 1 Bird Model 43RF Wattmeter
- 1 Simpson Model 260 Volt-Chm-Milliameter
- 1 RCA Model WV-87B V/T Veltmeter
- 1 Set tools for installing mobile equipment antennas

The estimated installation and testing time is four (4) weeks. If it is necessary to extend this time for any reason, the Installation Supervisor agrees to stay on until Westrex's representative, Mr. Peter Buck, is completely satisfied with the installation. Mr. Buck in representation of Westrex will decide if the installation is completed for the purposes of this agreement.

Installation assistance shall be provided by Westrex Singapore in the form of one technician, plus Westrex Manager, Mr. Peter Buck. Electrical, mechanical, and operational testing of base and mobile stations as a system shall be the responsibility of the Installation Supervisor, It is assumed that some local assistance from Saigon Police Department personnel will be available. The Installation Supervisor will, before leaving, thoroughly acquaint the Saigon Police Department personnel assigned to work with this system in the installation, operating and maintenance of all equipment and proper use of the test equipment furnished.
